*****NEW***** WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

This year we will celebrate the third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis in 2021 declared that this special day celebrating Grandparents and the Elderly is to be held on the fourth Sunday of July. This is close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. The theme this year coincides with that of World Youth Day taking place in Lisbon, Portugal, 'His mercy is from age to age' (Lk 1:50). This is taken from the meeting between Mary and Elizabeth (Lk 1:39-56), and links with the World Youth Day theme where Mary sets out to visit Elizabeth (Lk 1:39-56).

beth 'Mary arose and went with haste' (Lk 1:39). Pope Francis in his message to people for the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly asks young people who are travelling to Lisbon, before they leave, to visit an elderly person stating that "their prayers will protect you and you will carry in

ONLINE LUNCHTIME SESSION ON DEMENTIA AWARENESS Tuesday 1st August 12 noon til 1pm.

There are more than 850,000 people living with dementia in the UK today, with 81,000 in the South West. This number is predicted to double in the next 30 years and we will see this reflected in our congregations and communities. All our parishes will know someone living with dementia or caring for someone. You will already be providing pastoral care to people living with dementia and may already be taking steps to be a dementia friendly church. This one-hour introductory session is aimed at parish priests, secretaries, eucharistic ministers, pastoral workers and welcomers, members of SVP and all those whose lives are touched by dementia. It will focus on understanding dementia and the practical aspects of how to respond, but will also offer advice about resources to understand how to accompany those whose lives have been touched by dementia in their spiritual journey. CCSP ARE LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS

We are always looking for volunteers to join us either in the role of Parish Volunteer to help promote our small children's charity across the Diocese, or as a Trustee to serve on our Board which meets four times a year. We need enthusiastic people for our Board and your skill set might be just what we need – we are looking for people with professional skills in areas such as business/finance, HR and social care. This is a voluntary position, both rewarding and challenging. We are also looking for Youth Trustees to bring the views of young people to our work. We already have a number of Parish Volunteers set up across the Diocese and our newest recruit at St Joseph's in Newton Abbot organised a quiz night on Saturday, 17 June 2023 as they were unable to join in the last Great Big Diocesan Quiz in April due to a clash with Ten Tors. Over 60 people turned up and enjoyed a wonderful ploughman's thanks to a small number of volunteers who also helped to ensure everything ran smoothly on the night. As well as ticket sales, they had an amazing raffle and a whopping **£482.55** was raised !! Thank you to everyone who got involved and took part. We are currently receiving an unprecedented amount of applications to our Essential Grants programme as more and more families are struggling to pay for the basic essentials of life for their children such as a proper bed to sleep in, school uniform and shoes that fit and white goods including cookers, fridge/freezers and washing machines. At present, we have had to put a maximum limit on the amount of grant funding we can approve each month, as we simply cannot continue to approve the number of requests for support. Feedback from the families that we are able to support has been overwhelming as the grants really do make a massive difference to the lives of families living in our Diocese which includes Devon, Cornwall and parts of Dorset. Unfortunately, we can only approve a certain amount of funding each month and we are now having to turn families away, who we would previously have tried to help. It's hard to imagine that there are children who do not have a proper bed to sleep in, or

suitable shoes to wear to school and that there are families who can not afford to purchase a cooker to prepare healthy nutritious home cooked meals.
